A ferocious storm unlike any before

IT WAS one of the biggest storms Grafton has seen. and for Jan McGill. it started when she heard a noise coming from the upstairs of her office at the Grafton Industrial Village.

"I went upstairs to see what the noise was, and the doing what they could to hailstones were coming straight at the windows, and as I was standing there one of the windows broke right in front of me.

"It didn't go for long, 20 minutes or so and because the tower is tall, you could hear the glass falling as it was smashed. After the storm finished the hailstones were lying everywhere and the glass was falling so we had to close off the whole area." With glass still falling

from the tower, Mrs McGill called their insurance broker to see what could be done. "I called our insurance broker and just said 'I need some help'," Mrs McGill said.
